Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to school following the summer break. We are very excited to see you and your children again and to take you into our Marlborough Road family, if you are joining us for the first time. Below are some important dates for your diary and a reminder of some of our expectations.

Times Of The School Day

School starts at 8.50 am (not 9.00 am).

The breakfast club is open from 8.00 am and can be accessed through the gate on Dudley Street. Please do not send children before 8.00 am as we are not able to let them in until staff are in place. Children from Reception- Year 6 can attend without a family member, but Nursery children must be accompanied by an adult. Breakfast club is free.

The gate by the chippy opens at 8.40 am.

All children finish school at 3.20pm. Please try to be on time to collect your child. We know that sometimes things beyond your control happen and we really appreciate a phone call, if you find yourself in that position, so that we can reassure the child.

After School Clubs

A wide range of after school clubs are on offer at Marlborough Road Academy. Clubs will start w/b 18.9.23. Application letters will be sent out next week. Places are allocated on a first come first served basis for half a term and anyone who applies after a club is full is placed on a waiting list. We look forward to seeing as many children getting involved as possible.

Science club will start after half term.

<u>Uniform</u>

We expect all our pupils to wear the correct school uniform. In the autumn/winter, this consists of grey or black trousers, skirt or pinafore dress, a white polo shirt and a purple cardigan or jumper. To keep costs down, we keep branded items to a minimum and do allow children to wear purple jumpers and cardigans without the school logo on them. We also offer pre loved uniform free of charge and this can be found in the school office – just help yourself! We do ask that children wear black school shoes and not trainers. Trainers can be brought to school separately to wear in PE, along with a white T shirt and black shorts or leggings. Year 4 go swimming (from 15.9.23). All children need trunks (no shorts) or a costume (no bikinis or two piece sets), a towel and a swimming hat. Swimming hats are available



from the baths, sports shops or the school office and must be worn by all children regardless of their gender or the length of their hair. This is to keep hair out of the pool for hygiene reasons.

Term Dates And Attendance

You will find the term dates for the year on our website. Please note that we do not authorise term time holidays and that taking your child on holiday during school time will result in a fine being issued. The Principal can authorize absence to travel in **EXCEPTIONAL** circumstances, but a request MUST be made in advance and a discussion had with the Principal before anything is booked. Evidence to prove that the circumstances are exceptional will be required. Our attendance target this coming school year is 96%. This is in line with the pre pandemic national average for the country. Last year we achieved 92.4%, so we have work to do in this area. I am sure that you will agree that children's education has been disrupted enough over the last few years.

Our new attendance officer is Miss Wileman, who will be working closely with myself on improving our attendance and punctuality. We are keen to help where there are difficulties in getting children to school and/or being on time, so please do get in touch if you have an issue.

What's On?

We have a busy half term planned. You should receive information about what your child will be learning by Friday 8th September, so that you can help to reinforce learning at home. Please see the website for your child's weekly homework and ideas for educational websites and games.

- Monday 4th- Friday 8th September = 0 Waste Week. We will be aiming to throw away less food, use less energy and recycle more. Our votes for schools topic this week is related to throwing away less technology.
- Thursday 7th September is Orienteering Day. Each class will have a chance to use the courses that have been built around the school grounds. Pupils should still wear their uniforms for this activity.
- Wednesday 20th September = 'Voices Foundation' class visits = this is the start of a singing project that we are involved in this year
- Thursday 21st September = Y6 team building camp out and activities day. It is not too late to pay, if you would like your Y6 child to take part. It is a wonderful event and the sort of experience that children remember for the rest of their lives.
- Thursday 21st September = small sided football tournament at 'The Cliff' for Y3
- Friday 22nd September = We will be raising money for children with genetic disorders through the charity 'Jeans For Genes' on this day. For a donation of what ever you can afford, pupils can wear their jeans to school (with their school uniform on the top half).
- Monday 25th September = Yom Kippur, which we will mark with an assembly
- Friday 6th October = Y6 will watch a theatre production of 'Crossing The Lines', as part of their PSHE work on staying safe.
- Monday 16th October = Harvest Festival, which we will mark with an assembly and a collection
 of tinned and dried foods (rice, pasta etc). This year we are collecting ready to start our own
 food pantry for the local community.
- Wednesday 18th October = Parents' Evening for EYFS and K.S 1 (4-6pm)
- Thursday 19th October = Parents' Evening for EYFS and K.S 2 (4-6pm)



There will be other dates added to this list as the half term goes on. Please check the information board in the tunnel regularly and the calendar area on the website to stay up to date with what is happening.

Reading Books

By Friday 15th September all children in Reception-Y6 will have brought home a library book (this will start for Nursery after half term, once the children have settled into school). Pupils who are part of our phonics programme in Reception –Y6 will also bring home a reading book from the Read, Write, Inc scheme. This will be matched to their phonic ability and feature the sounds they have been learning that week. Pupils need to return their phonics reading book on a Friday each week and they will be issued with a new one. These books are designed to help children read with fluency, speed, accuracy and understanding, as they feature known sounds. This builds confidence and helps children to see themselves as successful readers quickly. We are very keen to foster a love of reading in all our pupils, as this is the key to future learning and a great source of pleasure.
