Principal's Message



Dear Parents/Carers

It was been a pleasure to welcome both you and your children back to school this week. They all look so smart and grown up in their new uniforms. We are very pleased with the way that everyone has settled into our new routines and classes are calm and purposeful. This week we have been focussing on re establishing our expectations of both behaviour and of learning. The whole school has taken part in an Art and History project, looking at famous statues in the Manchester area and thinking about the lives of the people they represent, their achievements and why different people may see their legacies differently. We have looked at the way the sculptors have used form, shape , colour, line to create the statues and the children have represented these in their own work.

We have also added information to our website about what each year group will be learning over the Autumn Term. 


